Happy March!! Boating is here!



HOUSE AND GROUNDS- RICHARD DENUNZIO

Hello PYC Members,

Thank you for your support,

Let me start off with an apology to the PYC Board members for missing the last two board meetings.

I took on the project to renovate my deceased father-in-laws home in St. Augustine, Florida in January of this year and finally finished it on February 27th.

Now on to business, I took a water sample from the swimming pool to a local pool company "Pools "N stuff (Evi Jeansonne) the water tested perfect. So as for the "Black algae concerns I believe from talking to several pool experts we should not have a problem unless the water PH was too high, which it isn't.

I have also contacted a civil engineering firm" H & H Consultants" Mr. Larry Jones who would inspect the condition of the pool and surrounding area and give us his recommendation as far the integrity of the pool and surrounding structure.

In the attic we have a 160 gallon hot water heater, which draws 70 amps and is underutilized the majority of time. I checked on the availability of a hot water heater timer, none exist for that amperage.

Since my last chart concerning the steel railing, Vaughan Sollberger sent an email to Kaia, which she passed on to me regarding technical coatings expert Brandon Lamasney whom I called and emailed the existing condition of the railing.

I gave him the particulars on the condition on the railing asked for his recommendations.

He emailed back his recommendations, which I will attach as a separate document.

Brandon's' recommendation is to remove all existing coatings, which will be the nastiest part of the project. I estimated it will take 350 man hours to complete this project over several months.

I will also put together a sequence of procedures for restoring the railing. If we do it right it should last for 8 to 10 years. Once I complete the sequence and procedures I will need volunteers to help complete this project.


