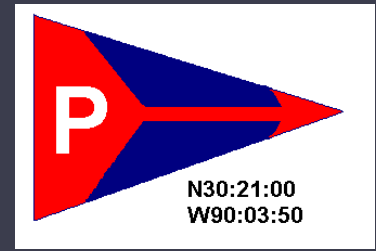

Juniors

The weekend of June 2-3 we held another successful School's out Regatta. The class that raced were VX One, 420 and Opti. The Pontchartrain members competing included Liam Eddy and Harrison Dodge in the Opti, Dylan McKnight and Evan Dauterive in the 420 and in the VX One Rob Doolittle with crew Matthew Dupuy.

We anticipate adding or have added two junior members this month, one from sail camp and one who is a friend of an existing sail team member. They are joining under our historical and well established junior sailing membership route. As a low cost membership geared to teenage kids, it is an effective tool to get kids on boats and interacting with other juniors at the club even without their family joining, but often leads to their families joining as well.

There are many, many active sailors at our club who originally joined as junior members. This membership category is absolutely critical and its use needs to increase. When you talk to your neighbors, friends and relatives who have teenagers please mention our junior sailing membership to them. The cost is only around \$200 for a year which is an incredible bargain.

As you all may know, we also have established our Junior Sailing Team, which is a program that junior members and children of members are eligible for and which provides regular instruction, practices, and organized travel to away regattas with the team. There are additional fees for the Junior team program and it is not required of all junior sailors. For the Junior Liptons event we draw from all eligible juniors who are accomplished sailors, who attend the Junior Lipton practices and who have exhibited the skill and maturity to represent our club in this GYA event. The Junior Liptons is a recognized part of the Capdeville Series and this year will be sailed in the Viper.

June 30-July 1 the Junior Sailing Team participated in the Junior Olympic Sailing Festival at Pensacola Yacht Club. If you all know PYC they put on a first class event and this year was no exception. The Junior's families support is critical to the success of the Junior Team.

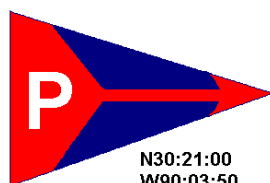
