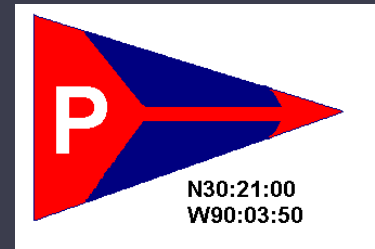

Commodore's Corner

This is something that has been talked about for many years and of course has the potential for greatness and failure. Kaia will be sharing the initial guidelines. To be honest I have concerns about doing this but I think we finally have the opportunity to try it and hopefully tweak it as needed to the satisfaction of everyone. Food sales are important in order for us to keep this designation. Please support our efforts by purchasing food at the club and remember, while on premise, please social distance and wear your masks. Be mindful to not post anything on social media showing close groups of people.

Cabbage ball seems to be our regatta replacement. Kaia organized a big cabbage ball tournament a few weeks ago. The start/finish line was home plate and the course was 1st, 2nd and 3rd base back to home. It was a lot of fun and as soon as I stop hurting I'd like to do it again! 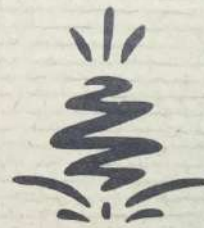

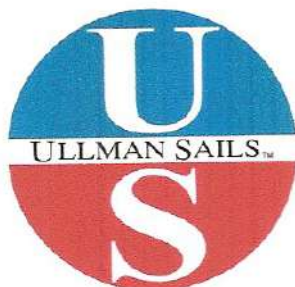
